CCCEOPSA Response

Restore EOPS, CARE, DSPS, and CalWORKs. These are categorical programs with longstanding demonstrated track record of promoting student success.

We strongly oppose any flexibility language/proposal as one group of vulnerable students should not be pitted against another for vital resources at the district level.
